



Hospital: Patient or family lounge

1. **Principle 4:** Noticeboards replaced with appropriate artwork that reflects the purpose of the space.
2. **Principle 7, 8 and 9:** Chairs in combinations of 2 - 4 to allow people to gather and talk. Provide different styles/colours and heights to give the patient an opportunity to choose which setting they would like to participate in.
3. **Principle 7:** Table set with placemat, flowers, cups of tea, and is timber finish so that objects on the table contrast.
4. **Principle 5:** Considered lighting such as new LED diffused ceiling lights and downlighting to kitchen bench.
5. **Principle 7:** Walls featuring décor such as drapery, artwork and bookshelves stocked with interactive items.
6. **Principle 1:** Limited contrast between different floor surface materials to promote clear pathway.
7. **Principle 10:** Residential looking storage with important items such as tea and coffee labelled/contrasting in colour and on display.
8. **Principle 1 and 7:** Equipment that is familiar (e.g. Kettle on countertop, induction cooktop with raised buttons).
9. Kitchen finishes are domestic in style and have some element of colour. Some cupboard doors with glass fronts to see contents.
